After more than **115 years** of commitment to improving access to healthcare worldwide, the **Dutch Society for Tropical Medicine and** International Health (NVTG) has a new name: the **Netherlands' Society** for Global Health (NSGH). This fresh identity reflects both our enduring mission and our evolving field.

The name change was officially adopted during Global Health Day on 15 May 2025 and will be further introduced to the wider public at the Fall Symposium in November, where we'll also launch our **new** website.

This **transition** is part of a broader movement to make the close collaboration between NSGH, KCGH and OIGT more visible. New logos and websites for all three organisations will gradually roll out, forming a shared visual identity that reflects our partnership and strengthens our collective visibility and impact.
